Attendance

We have recently reviewed our Attendance Policy in line with county and government guidelines and will upload this to our website before the end of the Spring term.

At St Nicholas, Primary School, we judge attendance using the following criteria:

Outstanding: 98 - 100% **Good:** 97-95% **Requires Improvement:** below 95%

We routinely monitor attendance and lateness and notify parents if their child's attendance falls below the minimum expectation of 95%, or they are persistently late. As stated in the February Newsletter, we are keen to offer any support we can, to ensure any issues that may be affecting your child's attendance rate or punctuality, are dealt with effectively. Therefore, if you receive a letter highlighting our concern, please make an appointment to see me or alternatively, we can offer a telephone consultation, if this is more convenient.

We will publish our Whole School Attendance percentage each month, against the National Standard. Our aim is to be 'Outstanding 'and this month we fall into the category of good: 96.6%

Please help us to reach our target by ensuring your children do not take holidays in term time and attend school regularly and on time.

Our school day commences at 8:45 and the register is taken at 8:55. Once again, thank you for your continued support
